

ANOTHER SET OF EXCELLENT A-LEVEL GRADES FOR THE STUDENTS AT REGENT COLLEGE

As at many other schools and colleges across the land, Regent College received its A level results on 11th March 2010. Being an independent college with small class sizes, the environment here is particularly close-knit meaning we get to know our students, and their hopes and dreams for the future, very well. This is why we watch with such interest and such pride on results day when we see students reaping the rewards for months of hard study.

We have had some excellent results within the AS year group and it is good to see so many of our students inspired by what they have achieved so far and looking forward to completing their AS level and moving onto A2. One such example is Jadesh Manivannan who came to us this academic year from Queen Elizabeth's School in Barnet. He took four papers this January and has come out with grades of AAAB. He performed particularly well in Chemistry and Maths obtaining scores of 94% and 93% respectively. Vlad Scinteie who joined the Sixth-Form from our Senior School gained just as good AS results as he did at GCSE with AAAB in Chemistry, Maths, Further Maths and Physics respectively. His Maths grades were outstanding, obtaining scores of 100% and 87% for two Maths units and 96% for his Further Maths. These grades have certainly helped him on his path to a medical degree.

Similarly, we have had some fantastic grades from our A2 students such as Rupesh Hirani who took three Accounting units and scored 100% in two of the papers and Aadarsh Shah who did brilliantly in his Maths papers, gaining scores of 98% and 91% in two of the units. Another real success story of which we are particularly proud as he is an international student, is Nnamdi Ume-Ezeoke. Of the five units he took in January, four of them were graded A.

For our Legacy syllabus students who are restricted to only re-sitting their A2 units due to the phasing out of the syllabus by the examination boards, the challenge of improving their grades is a tough one and the victory much the sweeter when that challenge is met successfully. We have had a number of high performing students this year such as Malitha Samarage who came to us from a top London school wanting to improve his grades. He now leaves us with 3 A grades. Another such example is Jeremy Strong, who came to us from another well-known London school and who has improved his grades in Biology and Mathematics from Cs to Bs. For these students, their months of hard work have not been in vain and they can look forward to starting on their chosen university course.

Overall, Regent College has outperformed various benchmarks including the nationally accepted ALPS model which uses a student's GCSE grades to work out the minimum grades that they should be able to achieve at A level. In the large majority of cases, we have in fact outperformed the index by two grades and for some of our students the value added has been as much as four whole grades.

We are now enrolling for September 2010 and would welcome applications from students who wish to mirror the successes of our students above.
